

Subjects	
English	Understanding character - empathic responses to a character from The Hobbit or a look at how Tolkien establishes setting. Choose one of the tasks (on Teams) and there are different ways you will be able to present your work (voice recording/ video/ writing etc) - Everything is explained on Teams and I will go over it AND the next chapter of the story in our lesson on Wednesday.
ESL	Laura's work will be available with Year 9 on Tuesday morning. Meeting at 10.15am British time to read part of the story to each other, Mrs Jeeves will be on location in Whitby town centre. Make sure you can access the pictures of the story pages. Written work this week continuing from last week about what Mina and Lucy can do in Whitby during their stay.
Maths	These tasks MUST be completed in order. Task 1: Complete mymaths. There are two algebraic tests, try to complete these ASAP. Task 2: Another colouring task using your understanding of the two Mymaths tasks. Task 3: An adapted treasure hunt. Please attempt any work before asking for help so that I can show you how to correct work rather than how to complete it in the lesson. Both task 2 and 3 are set assignments. Good luck!
Science Bio	Microscopic Fungi, how we use these organisms in everyday life, Tasks will involve some tutorial videos, note taking, questions and if possible a small practical. Total of approximately 90 minutes.
Science Chm	The deadline for the work on 'weathering and erosion' is Monday (27th 4pm). The new work on Sedimentary rocks will be released on Tuesday and the deadline will be Monday 4th May. The marked work on 'weathering and erosion' will be returned by the end of Thursday, and we have a 'chat' session Friday morning to discuss the marked work or you new task.
Science Phy	We will be looking at the components of light and how light filters can affect how we see things. Some use of Youtube and good note-taking essential. No more than 60-80 minutes of work.
Geography	Continuing work on climate change but looking at possible future outcomes for a variety of different areas. Scanned pages relate to the questions and all work is due in on Friday 01/05/20. Group meeting at 10.30am.
History	The class will be looking at the second great crisis of Charles II's reign this week, the Great Fire of London. They will examine the causes and consequences and have the opportunity to study some primary evidence through a look at extracts of Pepys diary. They will also have the opportunity to think about becoming their own diarist in the style of Pepys and Evelyn!
French	Continuing work on the house. This week year 8 are going to work on class notebooks and write some sentences using the a sentence builder. They will practise the negative using the pictures of missing kitchen items from last week, and do a further Language Gym assignment. Each task should take no more than 25-30 mins.
ICT	Python lesson 3 (pick up from where you finished last lesson). Most people got through lesson 2 and were looking at "chatbots". Lesson 3 extends this and shows you how to create IF - ELSE conditions. Meeting 14.00. Deadline Monday.
German	Our online tutorial is on Monday, 11am. After last week has been focussed on grammar, this week pupils are working on a project: Every pupil will be allocated a German/Swiss/Austrian city to which they are going to plan a weekend trip. In a powerpoint presentation they are going to describe the trip, what sights they will see etc. They will have a sentence builder to help them. Work to be handed in by Thursday, 6pm.
Drama	This week you will be continuing on from last week's lesson. Hopefully you made detailed notes on the performance of 'Treasure Island', this week you be using those notes to either write a review of the performance or design something for the performance. There are more details in the assignments area, this can be done by hand, away from the computer, then sent in as a photo or video. Your work should be submitted by Monday the 4th May to the Assignments area and I will be providing feedback by the time you have your next lesson. Music	Year 8 will be continuing on from last week on the topic 'Careers in Music'. This week you will be focussing on the job of a DJ and will have three tasks to complete in the Teams Assignments area. There are more details on the actual assignment, but this task should take roughly 1 hour to complete, you then have the option to complete one of the extension tasks (either practical or listening related). Your work should be submitted by Monday the 4th May to the Assignments area and I will be providing feedback by the time you have your next lesson. There will be one group chat at 1:30pm during your Thursday slot to ask any questions about the Drama and Music work. Art	Task 3 Use the internet to find a photograph of a reptile. Focus your drawing on a small section of scales using mark making techniques. Challenge yourself by completing a larger area using a variety of techniques or try using black biro instead of pencil. This work should take 2hrs to complete.
